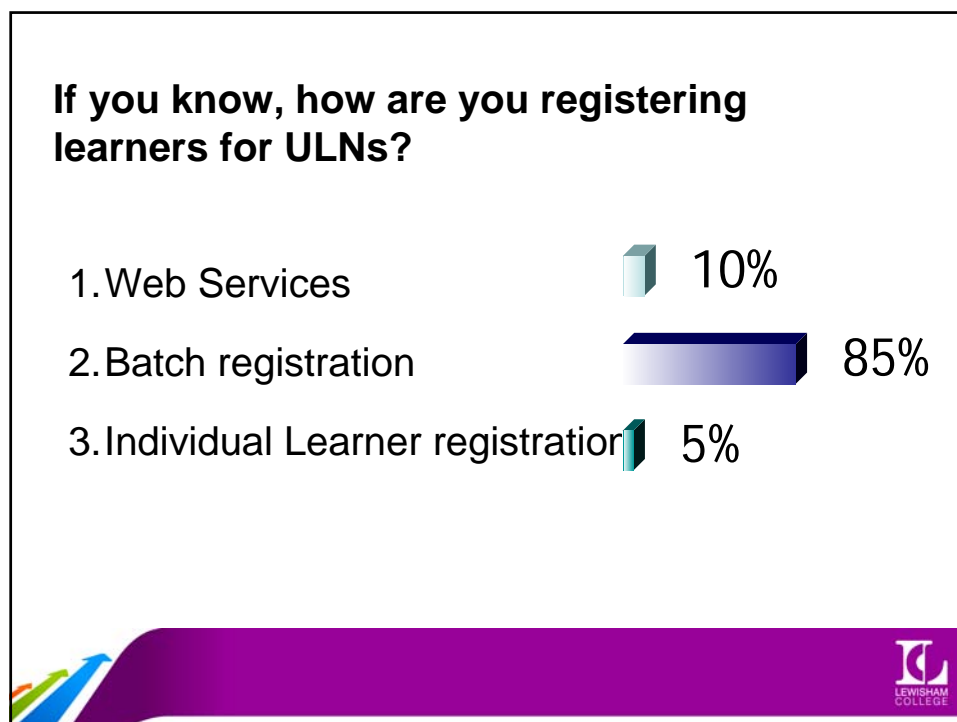
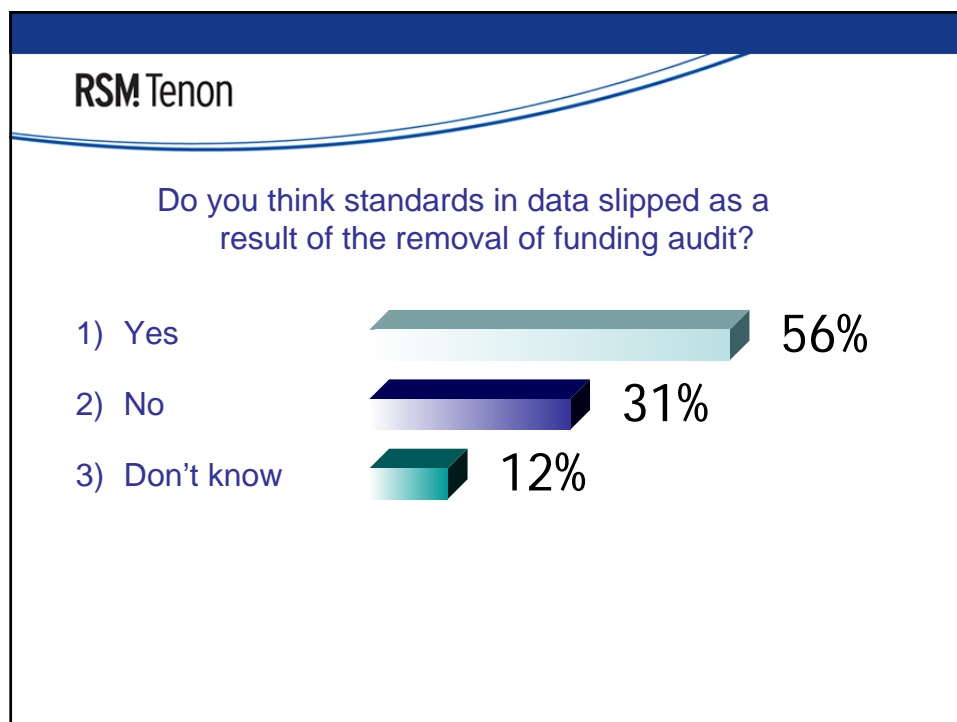
Before we kick-off, in your view the chance of England winning the world cup is



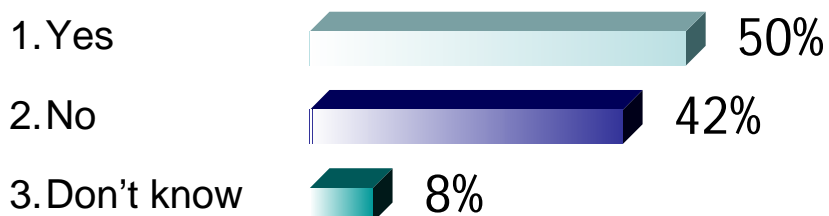

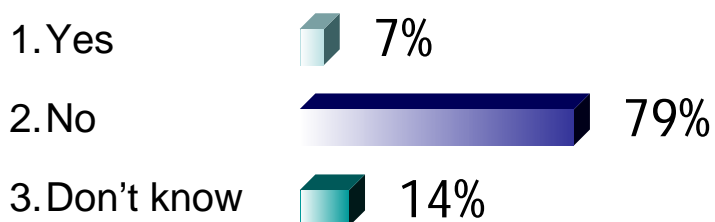




Are you expecting to register 100% of learners for a ULN in 2009/10?



Do your learners understand what a ULN and their Personal Learning Record is?

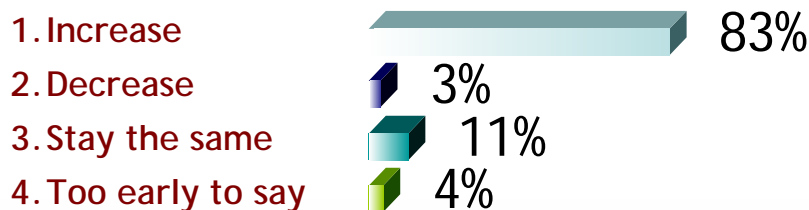

The Pearson Research Institute will donate all the proceeds from the sale of the conference slides to the Lewisham College Hardship fund.

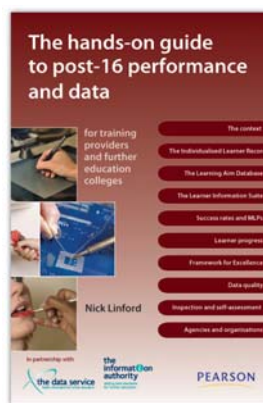
